## PASTOR'S CORNER

### "Everyone Who Exults Himself Will Be Humbled"

Jesus states in the Gospel a divine policy as the point of his parable, or its reverse. "The one who humbles himself will be exalted." (Lk 14:11) Jesus ties up his lesson on humility with a lesson on generosity. Generosity means being open-hearted and openhanded to those in need.

Francis of Assisi, the man many consider as the saint who most resembles Christ made himself a brother to all people regardless of their stature, class, even creed. And how he is able to do this? He others especially the lepers, the poor, the simple peasants many times better than himself for he saw Christ in them.

This great saint followed the example of the Son of God who humbled himself by "Emptying himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him." (Phil. 2:6-8) It is for this very resemblance to the poor, humble and obedient Son of God that he received the Father's favor. It is because of his humility that God was pleased to raise Francis of Assisi to the heights of glory and joy. As he had done, so we must do.

Each Sunday celebration of the Eucharist should lead us to do God's will always more joyfully and to serve our brothers and sisters with greater humility and dedication.

Reflection: On Labor Day, Human Work Made New

This "gospel of work" needs to be proclaimed anew this Labor Day. Our Catholic Catechism helps us with these insights: Human work proceeds directly from persons created in the image of God and called to prolong the work of creation by subduing the earth, both with and for one another. Hence work is a duty: "if any one will not work, let him not eat." Work honors the Creator's gifts and the talents received from him. It can also be redemptive. By enduring the hardship of work in union with Jesus, the carpenter of Nazareth and the one crucified on Calvary, man collaborates in a certain fashion with the Son of God in his redemptive work. He shows himself to be a disciple of Christ by carrying the cross, daily, in the work he is called to accomplish. Work can be a means of sanctification and a way of animating earthly realities with the Spirit of Christ. In work, the person exercises and fulfills in part the potential inscribed in his nature. The primordial value of labor stems from man himself, its author and its beneficiary. Work is for man, not man for work. Everyone should be able to draw from work the means of providing for his life and that of his family, and of serving the human community. The primordial value of labor stems from man himself, its author and beneficiary. By means of his labor man participates in the work of creation. Work united to Christ can be redemptive."
