### **The Justification of Adam**

The second manifestation of the epiphany is when Jesus was baptized in the river Jordan. In those waters, Jesus' identity and mission were made known to us. The Father's voice revealed that Jesus is "my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." No man, after having fallen and after the introduction of sin in nature, can please God. God endured humanity, often changing His mind through the intercession of holy people, whom He chose to represent His voice to Israel. The manifestation of the Holy Trinity, undivided, yet distinct, tells us that the man filled with the Spirit of the Lord, who was sent to "establish justice on the earth," has a mission that entails taking the weight of mankind's sinfulness upon Himself. As Jesus' humanity was able to satisfy God, His humanity also justifies our human existence. Unparalleled dignity, greater than what our first parents had in paradise, was given to man, and its price was paid by Him in Golgotha, when the condemned bones of Adam met the priceless blood of Jesus.

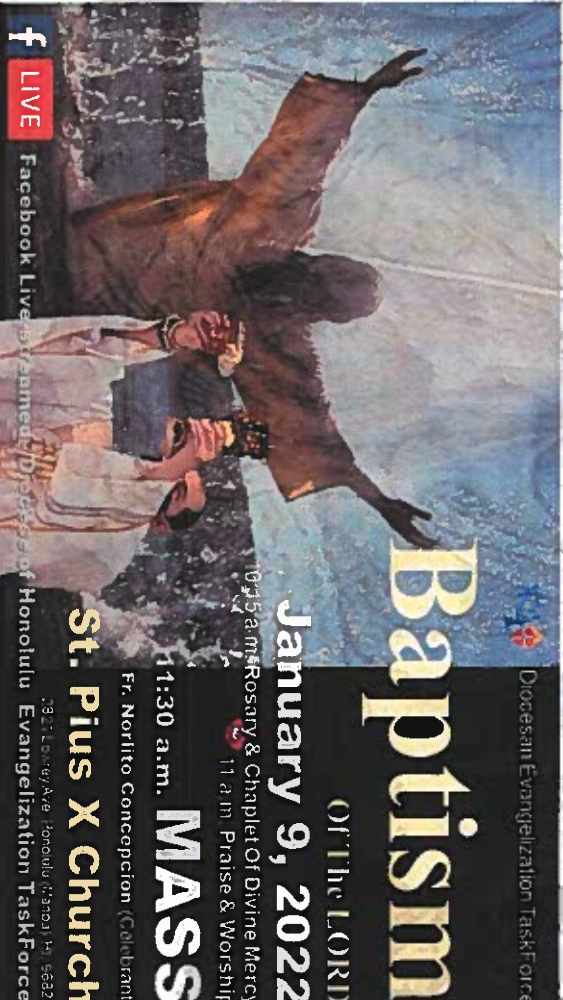

### THE MOST HOLY NAME OF JESUS

3 January

From the Apostolic times, the Church has professed that "at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Phil. 2:10). Through the particular efforts of St. Bernardine of Siena, devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus was promoted through the inscription of the monogram of the Holy Name (IHS) and the addition of the name of Jesus to the Hail Mary. In 1597, Pope Sixtus V first granted an indulgence for the uttering of the phrase used so often by St. John Paul II and included among the pious invocations of the current Enchiridion Indulgentiarum: "Praise be Jesus Christ!"

O God, who founded the salvation of the human race on the Incarnation of your Word, give your peoples the mercy they implore, so that all may know there is no other name to be invoked but the Name of your Only Begotten Son. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.
