On 1836, the second approved devotional medal (The Benedictine medal as the first) in the Church was attributed the Virgin Mother of God, Mary Most Holy. Saint Catherine Labouré stated that on 18 July 1830, the eve of the feast of Saint Vincent de Paul, she woke up after hearing the voice of a child calling her to the chapel, where she heard the Virgin Mary say to her, "God wishes to charge you with a mission. You will be contradicted, but do not fear; you will have the grace to do what is necessary. Tell your spiritual director all that passes within you. Times are evil in France and in the world. On 27 November 1830 the Blessed Mother returned once again. Our lady displayed herself inside an oval frame, standing upon a globe. Her hands shone rays of light over the globe. Around the margin of the frame appeared the words "Ô Marie, conçue sans péché, priez pour nous qui avons recours à vous" ("O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee"). The Blessed Mothers first proclamation that indeed She is the Immaculate Conception. Our parish Celebrates this Sunday, Our Lady of Miraculous Medal.

**Bl. Frederick Regensburg and The Flying Eucharist**

Ordered to chop wood when he desired to attend mass, while Holy communion was being distributed to the congregation, a Sacred Host levitated towards the monastery workshop, to the mouth of a friar it landed, and so the angels gave Frederick Holy Communion before the end of the mass. The final commemoration of the Augustinian calendar is reserved to a German lay brother, Blessed Frederick, whose secret to holiness and whose message to us, is one of humble service and generous offering of self for the well being of others.

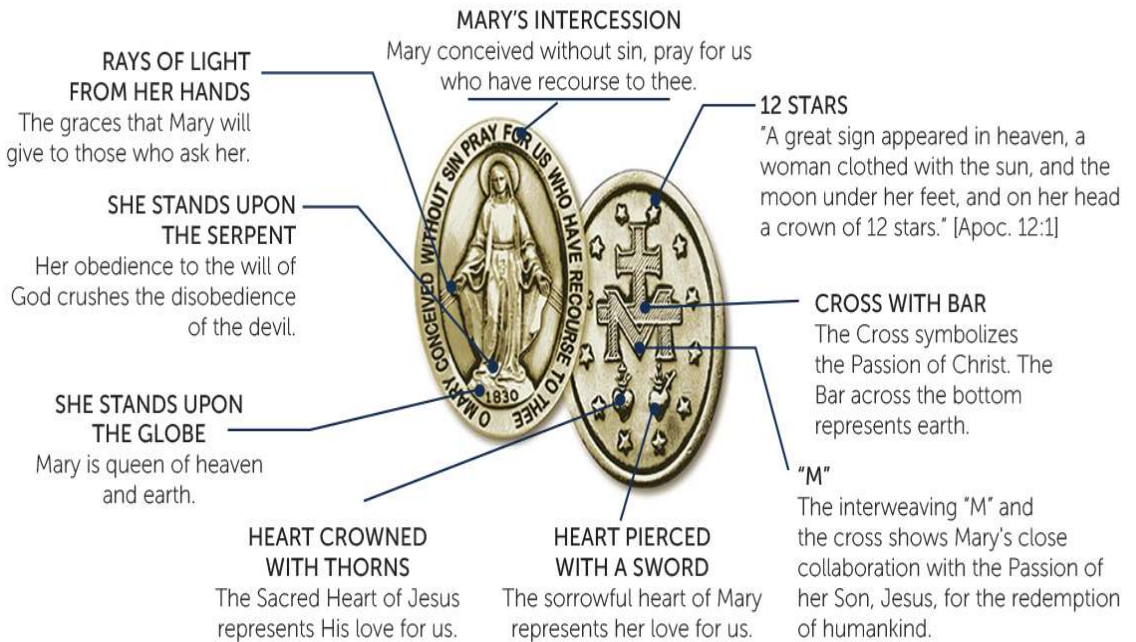
His life of prayer and devotion to the Eucharist were the food that nourished his spirit and strengthened his daily resolve to live for God and to practice love for his brothers - which is the heart of the Gospel.

Frederick was born in Regensburg (Ratisbon), Germany, and joined the Order there in the Monastery of Saint Nicholas. His life as an Augustinian was marked by humility and generosity, dedication to prayer and great devotion to the Eucharist. His talents served the community principally as carpenter and woodcutter, activities in which he demonstrated his concern for his fellow religious and the needs of the monastery.

Frederick died on November 29, 1329 in Regensburg where devotion to him continued without interruption, and the testimony of miracles attributed to his intercession, were gathered. Frederick is buried at St. Cecelia Church in the city of Regensburg. Pius X beatified him on May 12, 1909. History has not left us a great deal of factual information about Blessed Frederick. Perhaps this is an indication of the ‘ordinariness’ of this servant of God, who spent his religious life in fidelity to the daily cycle of prayer and work which characterize so many religious of his day and ours. Frederick reminds us that loyal devotion to one’s state in life, lived in faith, charity, and generosity, is the material of which holiness consists.

**Protection Along The Way**

The Holy Father designates this new liturgical year as the “Year of Hope.” Christians are not people of despair, but renewal. Hope is always hindered by the hopelessness of the past. Evil and bad memories can burden us in the journey towards renewal. We cannot wear the armor of Jesus if we will not surrender our old burdens. If we are enslaved by sin and evil, we cannot bear arms and face our greatest adversary which is darkness of sin. The reading for this first Sunday of Advent invites us to make the pilgrimage towards the birth of the Messiah, and in order not to stumble on the road, we are advised to leave behind the darkness of sin and to trust solely or exclusively on the armor of light. The dark road is upon us and beyond it is our joy. We must all exclaim Maranatha! Come Lord Jesus. Invoking Jesus as our armor and shield, who can be against us, who will hinder us in our journey towards salvation.
