## The Life of Contemplation, A Reserve of Fortitude for Christians

What is the first thing you do when you enter the church? Instead of first greeting Jesus through silent prayer, some people immediately look for their friends to ask them how they are doing. Do we find time to keep silent at the end of the day, even for 30 minutes, to pray and reflect on our day's activities? This Sunday is a lesson for us on how to respect sacred silence and contemplation. Let Jesus be our teacher, as he taught Martha the importance of the simplicity of contemplation and silence.

Martha was busy preparing things for a guest when she asked Jesus to convince her sister, Mary, to help. Instead of answering the favor of Martha, Jesus calmly reprimanded His friend. Jesus wasn't choosing Mary's inaction over Martha's good intention to act, but Jesus led Martha back to the practice of temperance (in her case, refraining from the extra attention to extra details and instead, focusing on moderation and simplicity of action).

The most charitable saints in the history of the church were the most contemplative. Even the most active and generous saints, like Mother Teresa of Calcutta and Angela Merici, did not fully immerse themselves in the activity of charity towards the needy. But they balanced themselves with prayer and contemplation, which we see through their deep reflections and insightful writings. Angela Merici would spend an hour in front of the Holy Eucharist before going to the streets to teach orphans and street children. Mother Teresa would make an overnight prayer once a month before calling an assembly of her sisters to discuss their apostolate and religious life formation.

## Bl. Teresa of St. Augustine and Companions, Virgin and Martyrs

As the French Revolution entered its worst days, sixteen Discalced Carmelites from the Monastery of the Incarnation in Compiègne offered their lives as a sacrifice to God, making reparation to him and imploring peace for the Church. On June 24, 1794, they were arrested and thrown into prison. Their happiness and resignation were so evident that those around them were also encouraged to draw strength from God's love. They were condemned to death for their fidelity to the Church and their religious life and for their devotion to the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. Singing hymns, and having renewed their vows before the superior, Teresa of St. Augustine, they were put to death in Paris on July 17, 1794.

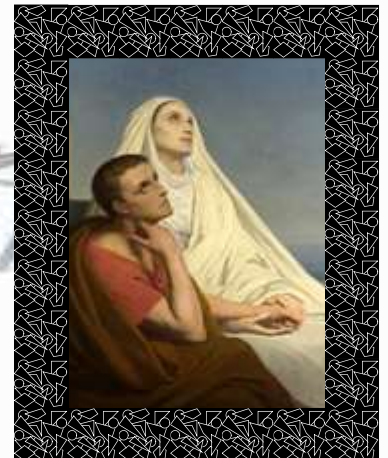
